FEMA COVID-19 Funeral Financial Assistance

This OCHCO Bulletin serves as a notification of the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) COVID-19 funeral financial assistance.

Under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2021 and the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, FEMA is providing financial assistance for coronavirus (COVID-19) related funeral expenses incurred after January 20, 2020, to help ease some of the financial stress and burden caused by the pandemic.

This is not a VA-administered program. A VA Medical Center cannot be an applicant for these funds; it must be an individual as described in FEMA's policy.

Eligibility for COVID-19 funeral assistance:

- The applicant must be a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national, or qualified alien who incurred funeral expenses after Jan. 20, 2020, for a death attributed to COVID-19. If multiple individuals contributed toward funeral expenses, they must register with FEMA under the same application as the applicant and co-applicant.
- An applicant may apply for the funeral expenses of multiple deceased individuals.
- The COVID-19-related death must have occurred in the U.S., including the U.S. territories, or the District of Columbia.
- There is no requirement for the deceased person to have been a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national, or qualified alien.
- This assistance is limited to a maximum amount of \$9,000 per funeral and a maximum of \$35,500 per application per state, territory, or the District of Columbia.
- Funeral assistance is intended to assist with expenses for funeral services and interment or cremation.

How to apply:

To submit an application, call the toll free COVID-19 Funeral Assistance line number 844-684-6333/TTY: 800-462-7585 to speak with a FEMA representative, Monday-Friday 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. Eastern Time.

Documentation required:

- An official death certificate that attributes the death to COVID-19 and shows the death occurred in the U.S. The death certificate must indicate the death "may have been caused by" or "was likely the result of" COVID-19 or COVID-19-like symptoms.
- Funeral expense documents (receipts, funeral home contract, etc.) that include the applicant's name, the deceased individual's name, the amount of funeral expenses, and dates the funeral expenses were incurred after January 20, 2020.
- Proof of funds received from other sources specifically for use toward funeral costs. Funeral assistance may not duplicate benefits received from burial or funeral insurance, financial assistance received from voluntary agencies, federal/state/local/tribal/territorial government programs or agencies, or other sources.

VA.gov Site Becomes Central Login for Accessing Benefits

WASHINGTON — Veterans and their families may begin accessing their Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) benefits and services on the new and user-friendly <u>VA.gov</u> website starting April 30.

Users will be able to access information about VA benefits and services through a single site rather than through multiple locations.

All benefits-related features previously located in the <u>eBenefits</u> web portal will be available on <u>VA.gov</u>. Veterans are encouraged to start logging into the site using their current Digital Service (DS) Logon or creating a new account using ID.me.

"VA.gov offers Veterans an enhanced site in terms of usability and security with the implementation of two factor authentication," said Acting VA Under

Secretary for Benefits Thomas Murphy. "The most frequently used features are now readily accessible on one website to include the ability to file a disability claim, check the status of a claim or change direct deposit and payment history."

The eBenefits site will remain functional through March 31, 2022, to give Veterans an opportunity to complete claims started on the platform. Thereafter, VA.gov becomes the single source solution to access VA benefit and service information online.

U.S. Digital Service worked with thousands of Veterans to test the new and improved VA.gov. The department wanted to ensure Veterans deemed the site functional before migrating Veterans' data.

VA to Readjudicate Veteran and Survivor Claims for possible Herbicide Exposure

WASHINGTON — Veterans who were previously denied service connection for an <u>herbicide related presumptive condition</u> due to lack of in-country Vietnam service will have their claims automatically readjudicated by VA.

The department began readjudicating claims in April for Veterans who served in the offshore waters of the Republic of Vietnam during the Vietnam War but were denied for one or more herbicide related conditions, on the basis that military service was not performed on the landmass of the Republic of Vietnam or on its inland waterways.

"Readjudication means VA will review the evidence of record and provide replacement decisions in the cases of Veterans who were previously denied service connection benefits," said Acting VA Under Secretary for Benefits Thomas Murphy. "We have the proper resources in place to meet the needs of our Veteran community and will ensure all eligible Veterans' and their survivors' claims are examined thoroughly and fairly."

The review also applies to eligible survivors of deceased Vietnam-era Veterans and is part of the Veterans Benefits Administration's implementation of the Nov. 5, 2020, U.S. District Court for the Northern District of California order in Nehmer vs. U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, requiring VA to readjudicate previously denied claims. VA will determine if benefits for qualifying disabilities can now be paid retroactively to the date of previously denied claims. The court's decision requires automatic readjudication in such cases without requiring a new claim, and potentially paying benefits to the survivors or estates of deceased beneficiaries.

More information is available regarding VA disability benefits based on <u>Agent Orange exposure</u>.

Blue Water Navy - Nehmer

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) announced it will readjudicate claims for Veterans who served in the offshore waters of the Republic of Vietnam during the Vietnam War.

This review is part of the Veterans Benefits Administration's implementation of the November 5, 2020, U.S. District Court of the Northern District of California decision to readjudicate previously denied claims as applied in Nehmer vs. U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.

Veterans who were previously denied service connection for an herbicide related presumptive condition due to lack of in-country Vietnam service will automatically have their claims readjudicated.

Readjudication means VA will review the evidence of record and provide replacement decisions in the cases of Veterans who were previously denied service connection for one or more herbicide related conditions on the basis that military service was not performed on the landmass of the Republic of Vietnam or on its inland waterways. This review will also apply to eligible survivors of deceased Vietnam era Veterans.VA is dedicated to ensuring all Veterans receive the benefits they have earned.

VA ensures that we have the proper resources in place to meet the needs of the Veteran community. Eligible survivors of deceased Veterans may also benefit from the policy and may be eligible for benefits based on the Veterans' service.

UPDATE ON VA COMPREHENSIVE FAMILY CAREGIVER EXPANSION

The rollout of the expansion of VA's Program of Comprehensive Assistance for Family Caregivers (PCAFC) began on October 1, 2020. As of April 2021, VA reports having received over 70,000 applications. VA has acted on over 40,000 of those applications and 30,000 were pending further action. Of those reviewed, VA has approved 5,000 applicants and denied 38,000.

VA has provided several reasons for the denials. Some of the reasons given for denials at the time of intake are listed below:

- 7,500 applications or 19 percent were denied because they did not have a singular or combined VA disability rating of 70 percent or greater.
- 5,800 applications or 15 percent were denied because their serious injury was not within the current eligibility dates (on or before May 7, 1975, and on or after September 11, 2001).
- 400 applications or one percent were denied because the individual does not receive care at home or will not do so if VA designates a Family Caregiver.

VA provided some of the following reasons for denying applications based on assessment of the veteran by VA's Centralized Eligibility and Appeals Team (CEAT):

- 12,100 applications or 31 percent were denied because the veteran did not require personal services for six months due to activities of daily living or supervision, protection or instruction needs.
- 2,900 applications or seven percent were denied because participation in the PCAFC was deemed not in the veteran's best interest.
- 1,800 applications or four percent were denied because the veteran did not require personal care services that would be provided by the Family Caregiver or such services would be simultaneously and regularly provided by or through others.
- 60 applications or one percent were denied because the caregiver was assessed to be not capable nor willing to provide the personal care services.

We will continue to closely follow the implementation of the expansion of VA's PCAFC. If you have specific questions about your application, please contact your National Service Officer for assistance.

GAO RELEASES REPORT ON AIRPORT ACCESSIBILITY

Air travel for people with disabilities can be very challenging for a variety of reasons, including access problems at airports. In our nation's airports, people with disabilities can face infrastructure, information, and customer service barriers. For example, complex terminal layouts and long distances between gates can be hard to navigate. Additionally, travel information is not always available in a format that is accessible to all.

According to stakeholders, while no solution meets all needs, a number of practices can help reduce or eliminate some of these barriers to equal access at airports. For example, some selected airports use external disability community and passenger groups to proactively engage in identifying barriers and developing solutions. Other airports have implemented technology-based solutions, such as mobile phone applications to make airport navigation easier.

The FAA Reauthorization Act of 2018 included a requirement for the Government Accountability Office (GAO) to review leading airport accessibility practices for passengers with disabilities, as well as required training for airline and contract service personnel who assist these passengers throughout the airport. Earlier this month, GAO released the report, Passengers with Disabilities: Airport Accessibility Barriers and Practices and DOT's Oversight of Airlines' Disability-Related Training. The report includes an examination of stakeholder-identified barriers that passengers with disabilities face when accessing airport facilities, accessibility practices to assist passengers with disabilities, and the efficacy of the Department of Transportation's (DOT) oversight of airlines' disability-related training.

As part of its review, GAO examined relevant federal laws, regulations, DOT documents, literature, as well as information describing disability training provided by selected airlines and contractors. GAO also interviewed a sample of stakeholders, including those at 16 U.S. airports selected based on size and geography, eight large and low-cost domestic airlines selected based on the greatest number of disability-related passenger complaints and enplanements, and six aviation service contractors working for those airlines. GAO also conducted interviews with DOT officials and 10 disability advocacy organizations, including PVA.

Midwest Honor Flight Update

The Honor Flight Network has released a statement that will be of interest to veterans and guardians on Midwest Honor Flight waitlist, as well as to the volunteers. While 2021 Honor Flights remain postponed nationwide until at least August 15, the Honor Flight Network has announced that, once it has been determined that it is safe to resume flights, proof of full vaccination will be required for veterans and their guardians who take an Honor Flight in 2021.

Mandatory vaccination will be just one of the safety measures that will be implemented. Veterans who choose not to be vaccinated (or who are not able to be vaccinated) will remain on the "fly list" until the Honor Flight Network removes this mandatory safety measure and will then be added to flights in the order that their applications were received (as usual). Guardians and volunteers who travel with veterans will also be required to present proof of vaccination before flight day and bring their vaccination proof along on flight day for any flights that take place in

2021. The Honor Flight Network stated that there will be no exceptions to this rule.

While we do not yet have information about when or how the proof of vaccination will need to be submitted or presented, we wanted the veterans and guardians on the fly list to know about this requirement with plenty of time to plan for compliance. "Fully vaccinated" is defined by the Honor Flight Network as having received the second dose of the Moderna or Pfizer vaccine at least two weeks prior to the flight date or the single dose Johnson & Johnson vaccine 28 days prior to the flight. There is no information yet about "boosters" or whether or not those might be required in the future.

"Our first priority on every Midwest Honor Flight Mission is the safety of our veterans, guardians, and crew," says Aaron Van Beek, the President of Midwest Honor Flight. "Should we have the chance to fly this fall, we will be implementing these precautions alongside the Honor Flight Network so we can continue to carry out our Mission without forcing veterans to choose between their health and this once-in-a-lifetime experience."

The Honor Flight Network's Board of Directors and Midwest Honor Flight's Board of Directors will continue to consult public health guidance before officially resuming trips and announcing final protocols.

The VA Regional Office in Sioux Falls continues to be open from 7:30am to 5pm each business day except for Federal Holidays. Public contact at the Sioux Falls VA Regional Office is open from 8am to 4:30pm. If an individual is fully vaccinated they are not required to wear a mask. Masks for those vaccinated are thus optional. But on the Hospital side of the Sioux Falls VA campus masks are still required.


The Fargo, ND VA Regional Office is open currently from 8am to 1:30pm each business day. However on June 1st those hours will expand to 8am to 4pm.

All three of the VA Hospitals in North and South Dakota (Black Hills SD VA, Fargo ND VA, and the Sioux Falls SD VA) are still not accepting outside referrals to their respective CLC Units and thus not allowing any respite care as well. We encourage Veterans to reach out to their local VA facility to see if they have contracted for respite care in their local community.

Just another reminder but please keep us informed of your current address, phone numbers and email address (if you have one). Further, please set up your voice mail box on your telephone lines and please keep them emptied out as much as possible. And please do not file claims on your own as that is one of the main functions of our office when we represent you.

In a recent Stakeholder's call with the Black Hills VA we were notified that Sandra Horsman, the Director will be retiring in October of 2021 and that Teresa Forbes will be jumping to another position other than the Public Affairs Officer. Teresa is now the Chief Experience Officer. We want to wish Ms. Horsman all the best in her upcoming retirement from the VA and to Ms. Forbes in her new position as well.

The VA is sending out Nehmer letters to Vietnam Veterans and to family members of those Vietnam Veterans who have passed away regarding the potential for additional benefits. You do not necessarily need to respond to those letters. Also, they are sending out clothing allowance reminders to those Veterans who receive that benefit on an annual basis. We will be sending out those clothing allowance forms very shorty. Lastly, we encourage you to be mindful of the ultimate sacrifice many of our Service Members and Veterans have made for our great country as we approach Memorial Day.

Extensions to Temporary Policies initiated in April 2020

In February, the Department of Veterans Affairs announced a set of extensions to temporary policies initiated in April 2020 and aimed at providing veterans continued financial relief due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

By way of an executive order from the White House, the moratorium on evictions and foreclosures, as well as VA loan forbearance requests, has been extended to June 30, while the pause of all veteran benefit overpayments and medical copayment debts has been extended through Sept. 30.

"Veterans can sometimes face unexpected debt collection from the VA, some of which is due to overpayments that weren't even their fault," said Washington Headquarters Executive Director Randy Reese. "Extending this pause on debt collections, in addition to the pause on evictions and home foreclosures, will give veterans in need much-needed financial relief while navigating the trying times of COVID-19."






